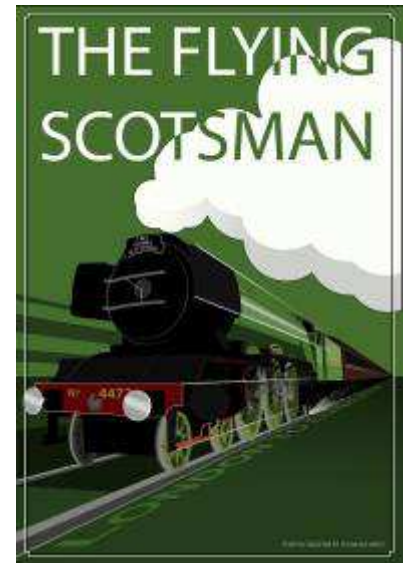

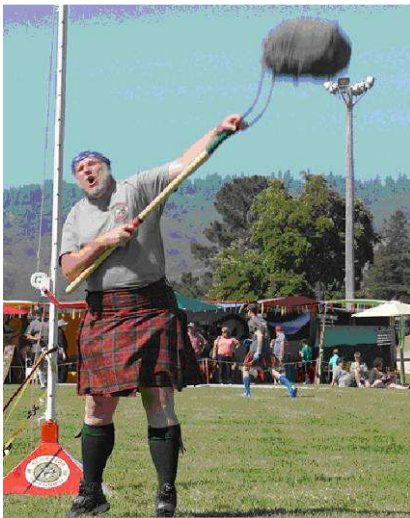
The Santa Cruz Scottish Festival- No matter what your pleasure may be, there's something for everyone!!!

Although modest in size in comparison to the Pleasanton Games, when you need a break from all your wondering around, one can

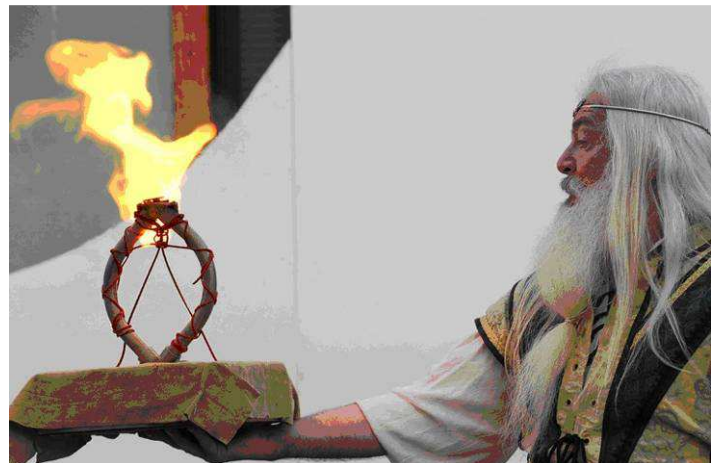
simply settle down and watch some of the finest modern and traditional Celtic bands and soloists.

If you have a child or grandchild between 4th and 6th grade, they receive free entrance by turning in a "Brave" coloring contest entry form downloadable from the fair site

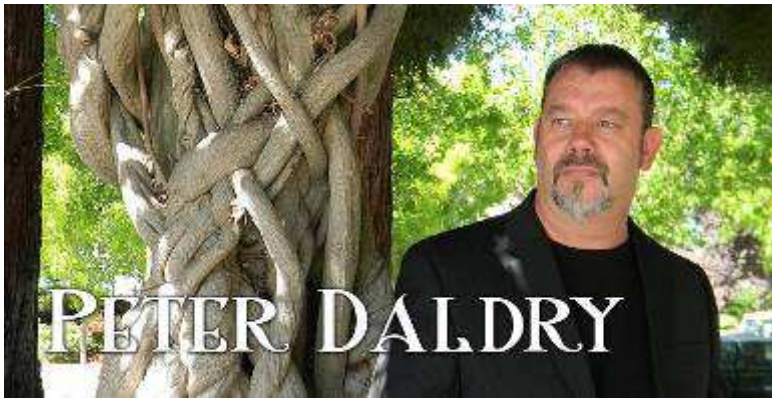

LOCAL SCOTTISH MUSICIAN IS NOMINATED FOR AWARD

Where are you from?: I am originally from the town of Clydebank, about 8 miles west of the city of Glasgow in Scotland. I now live in the U.S.A. in the town of Mountain View, California. I have been a resident since 1994.

Genre: Celtic/Folk singer/songwriter **Categories Entered:** A Cappella, I also entered the Folk Singer/Songwriter and World Traditional categories. **Work Submitted:** "I Wish I Was in Glasgow" **Artists Featured:** Just myself on this track. **Label:** Self-released

Who are your influences?: I have many! But of the many, I think I can narrow it down to three or four! My singing influences are the great Scottish singers Dick Gaughan and Andy M. Steward. For songwriting, probably Dougie McClean and David Francey. Also been listening to a lot of Richard Thompson. All fantastic singers and songwriters. Being a guitar player also, I am influenced by Thompson and Gaughan, but I love to listen to a lot of Bluegrass and old time Americana pickers like Tony Rice, Doc Watson and Norman Blake.

Describe your nominated work: I am nominated in the A Cappella category for the song "I Wish I Was in Glasgow" by Billy Connolly. I decided some time back that I would include an a cappella song on my album releases. First, because I think I do it well and secondly, because coming from Scotland, I always liked the old way of singing unaccompanied.

Did you use any unusual effects in this recording? No, just me and my voice.

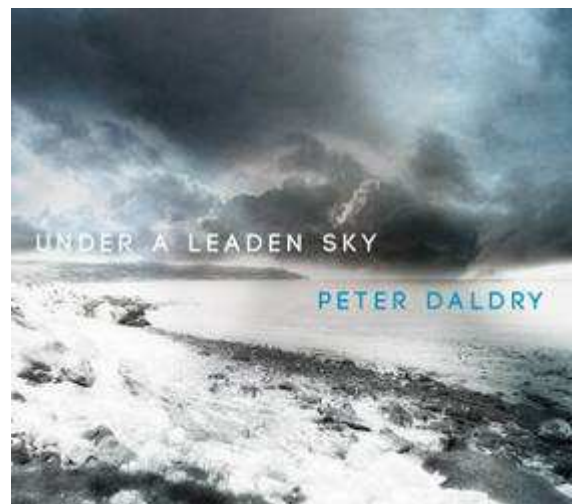
What's your definition of success?: Success is all the little steps it's taken to get this far and sometimes is a long road. As long as you stay on it and make choices and decisions, that will hopefully take you to where you want to go. Goals for success will change as other goals are met. Some people have different definitions of success. For me it would mean making music, touring and having enough money to be financially stable...being happy and content doing what I'm doing. **How will you leverage your IMA honors to achieve your career goals?:** Hopefully by continuing to work at my craft, singing and songwriting. I hope this nomination opens some doors and gives me more recognition and more exposure to bookers and talent buyers and to the fans, because without the fans, you don't have a career. People seem to enjoy my voice! I think my fans are unique because they are from all walks of life and they enjoy a good story! They allow me to be me! I am often told that telling the story behind the song and the banter between songs is just as rewarding for them as the songs themselves.

What is your guilty pleasure on the road? Book stores and record stores: I love them! Usually, I will search for old music books that are out of circulation or CDs that you cannot find anymore.

What do you have in the works for the upcoming year?: Hopefully doing more shows, and touring more. This is what I love to do! I would like to go back into the studio and record some more. Would like to entertain the possibility of singing on other people's projects.

FALLEN KING'S POSSESSIONS TO RETURN NORTH OF THE BORDER FOR FIRST TIME IN FIVE CENTURIES

A sword and dagger belonging to the last Scottish king to die in battle are to return to Scotland for the first time in 500 years. The sword, dagger and an emerald ring were taken from the body of King James IV after he was defeated by the English at the Battle of Flodden in 1513. Now, to mark the 500-year anniversary of the battle, they will be put on display in the Smith Museum in Stirling. The weapons had huge significance as they are the only physical link to King James IV, the last king to die in battle on the British Isles, as the whereabouts of his body are unknown.

At our last General Meeting in July, the topic of Movie Night selections came up for a brief discussion.

On getting home that evening I became curious as to what movies we have shown over the past number of years.

Since I have a fairly complete file of the Seanachie newsletter as well as a file of the announcements that Claudia Smurthwaite used to put out, I dove into the topic. Many hours later I came up with some interesting findings that I thought some of our members might find of interest.

First off, as closely as I can determine, Movie night in the SBSS started in 2001 being initiated by Cecily & Bruce Dewing. Initially films were not shown on a regular basis, also I remember some of our early films were projected on to a sheet fastened on the back of the Dewing's residence. We would all bring snacks to share and warm clothing for when it became cool after dark and outside. They were fun though.

We started showing films in pizza parlors rather early on, in fact I recall checking on dozens of pizza parlors trying to find any that didn't charge or require a pretty high minimum attendance to use their back room, if they had one.

I remember that Mountain Mike's on Hamilton was our home for a few years, though we would still revert to the "outdoor" theatre at the Dewing's in appropriate weather.

It was probably in about 2003 that our "Film Maven" Claudia Smurthwaite took over conducting the Movie Night on a regular basis at our current venue at the Round Table Pizza Parlor on Pollard Rd. in Los Gatos. With one or two exceptions we have had our movies at this location since then.

I was unable to compile a 100% accurate list of films shown because on several occasions only a TBA was listed, so I have no way of knowing what was shown. Going on known films only, I came up with 100, with seven of those being duplicates or reruns.

Claudia conducted a very entertaining movie night. A quiz based on the theme of the film with candy prizes for the winners. We were all sorry to see Claudia stop coordinating the event sometime in 2010.

Next Frank Cameron and myself took over but neither Frank or I had the sophisticated computer software to produce the artwork and quizzes that so enlivened Claudia's work.

The films shown have ranged from high drama to travelogue types, from recently produced ones to the early 1930's. Of course one of those selected for a rerun was "[So I Married an Axe Murderer](#)" which our own past member John Taylor and his musicians took part.

If you haven't ever partaken of this event, come join our group of regulars. Watch a good film, enjoy good food and a chance to get together with your fellow SBSS members.

We schedule films from February through October, generally on the third Friday of the month at 7:00pm at the Round Table Pizza Parlor at 1472 Pollard Rd., Los Gatos. [map](#)

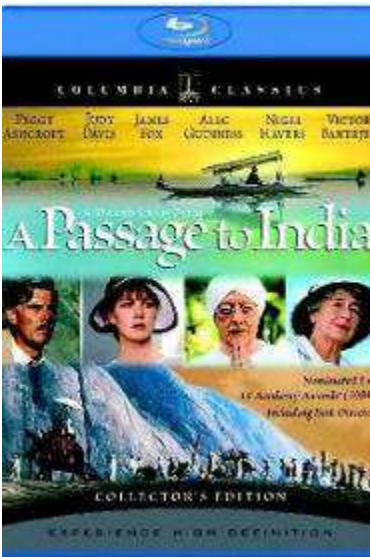
